## The 69<sup>th</sup> Summer Course of Polish Language and Culture

Course dates: August 5–30, 2024.

Application deadline: until July 10, 2024.

Location: Warsaw, Faculty of Modern Languages, 55 Dobra Street

## 3500 PLN, 4 ECTS credits

Polish language classes are scheduled from Monday to Friday\* from 9.30 a.m. to 12.45 p.m. (CET). Language course includes 76 hours of classes. In the afternoon, students will have an opportunity to participate in various supplementary activities (at least 25 additional hours of classes on Polish language, culture, and history).

Morning language classes will enable course participants to develop their communication skills. During classes, there will also be space for focusing separately on listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Students, regardless of their level, will have an opportunity to improve their knowledge of grammar from a pragmatic point of view. Classes will consist of units corresponding to the needs of learners at different levels of proficiency:

A1	Everyday communication – dialogues in real-life situations (8h)
	Games – reading, pronunciation exercises, using useful vocabulary (8h)
A2	Conversation classes – the art of argumentation (8h)
	Everyday communication – games, role-play exercises (8h)
B1	Writing – essay, short story (8h)
	Listening – exercises based on the state certificate examination requirements (8h)
B2/C	Writing – argumentative text, short story with elements of dialogue (8h)
	Vocabulary workshops – literary, journalistic, and scientific texts (8h)

Afternoon activities include language workshops/lectures on the culture and history of Poland, film screenings, visits to museums, guided walks around Warsaw, dance workshops, and integration events.

Practical information:

- We do not provide accommodation. Course participants are offered preferential prices while booking accommodation in the UW dormitory.
- \*On August 15 and 16, due to a national holiday and a long weekend, there will be no classes. These hours will be made up for on August 12 (until 2.45 p.m.), 19 and 21 (until 1.30 p.m.)
